Dear Mr. Spellman:

Thank you for your interest in the Greenville County Speed Hump Program. This program is completely dependent on people, such as you, who care about the safety of our neighborhoods. The minimum qualifications for the program is based on requirements set by County Council have changed and are listed below. If any of these minimum requirements are not met, the street will not qualify for the program and cannot be reconsidered for two years.

- The road must have an Average Daily Traffic (ADT) and an 85th Percentile Speed (85th Speed) within the limits of this chart. (The 85th Speed is the speed at which 15% of the traffic is traveling at or above.
- The road must be at least 1000' long and have a grade less than 8%.
- The road must be classified residential (not collector).

85th Speed (mph over posted speed limit)	ADT (vehicles per day)
15.0 ≤	600 ≤
10.0 ≤	675 ≤
9.0 ≤	800 ≤

Upon performing a traffic study,

Weatherstone Lane has an ADT of **179** vehicles per day and an 85th percentile speed of **29.2** mph

Hillstone Drive has an ADT of **444** vehicles per day and an 85th percentile speed of **28.4** mph.

Therefore these streets do not qualify for the Speed Hump Program at this time. However, please call 467-7010 to request "Slow Down for Safety" signs which are free and available at County Square, Suite 3800.
